A View From the Bridge

A SEPTEMBER HAPPENING THAT FETES ART AND CARS IS SHIFTING PERCEPTIONS ABOUT BOTH.

Who's to say that cars, golf and art don't mix? The Bridge, a unique celebration of creativity and vehicular culture, returns for the third time on Sept. 15 with a motley crew of notable automobiles (vintage and new) and the September Art Fair at The Bridge, a roundup of 12 contemporary galleries set up on the site of the historic Bridgehampton Race Circuit that today is a golf club.

This uncommon pairing of realms is quickly gaining in popularity. Automotive enthusiasts from all over the globe have been drawn to see and be seen among an unprecedented lineup of vehicles. Last year the stars of the show included a 1957 Jaguar XKSS, the first of 16 built; a 1957 Porsche Speedster, originally raced by factory driver Lake Underwood and a veteran of the Bridgehampton Race Circuit; and a 1968 Chevrolet Corvette NART Le Mans race car.

The art component is equally impressive. Organized by Suzanne Butler from CANADA and Max Levai and Pascal Spengemann from Mariborough Contemporary, this year the fair has doubled the number of partaking galleries; participants include Reyes Projects, Johann König Galerie, Vito Schnabel and David Zwirner Gallery.

Engineering geeks will be thrilled to learn that the sponsoring brands—think Pagani, McLaren and Rolls-Royce—are dispatching their chief designers and engineers to share insight into their respective creations. The same can be said about horology enthusiasts, who will experience the debut of a never-before-seen limited-edition watch by Richard Mille, one of the event's major underwriters.

"Since buying this property, the land was calling for this," says Bob Rubin, the event's co-creator who has owned the race circuit and founded The Bridge golf club. "It's about celebrating the art, history and function of the automobile to reimagine what a concours could be. As The Bridge continues to grow its car and contemporary art elements, we are shifting perceptions." Sept. 14-16, 1180 Millstone Road, Bridgehampton, bridgeorama.com
